The AA Principles of the Month

April

Step 4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

Tradition Four: Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or AA as a whole.

1. Do I insist that there are only a few right ways of doing things in AA?
2. Does my group consider the welfare of nearby groups in its actions and decisions? Of AA “as a whole”?
3. Do I judge or criticize other members’ behavior when it is different from mine, or do I learn from it?
4. Do I always bear in mind that, to those outsiders who know I am in AA, I may to some extent represent our entire beloved Fellowship?
5. Am I willing to help a newcomer go to any lengths—their lengths, not mine—to stay sober?
6. Do I ever criticize certain groups because I think they don’t do things how I believe AA should be done?

Concept IV: At all responsible levels, we ought to maintain a traditional “Right of Participation,” allowing a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge.

- What is the “Right of Participation”?
- Is there a spiritual reason underlying this Right? What does “...in reasonable proportion...” mean?
- Do I expect that, because I’m an A.A. member, I should be allowed to vote in election at any group, even if I am not an active member of that group?
- Do I attend my home group’s business meetings regularly as a participant rather than an onlooker?

Officer and Committee Chair Reports

Delegate's Connection

The weekend of March 13-15, Sue and I attended the Northeast Regional Delegates (NERD) Reunion in Wilmington, Delaware. It was a valuable opportunity to connect with the other Delegates in our region and to learn from those who have served before us. These relationships matter. They help us share experience, ask better questions, and prepare more fully for the General Service Conference. I am grateful to Area 48 for supporting my attendance—this preparation directly strengthens how I serve you.

◆◆ What's Happening in A.A. Service

General Service Board (GSB)

The General Service Board, along with the AA World Services (AAWS) and Grapevine/La Viña boards, continues its regular quarterly work guiding A.A.'s service structure.

A few highlights:

◆◆ Literature & Publications

There is a lot happening in A.A. literature right now:

- The Plain Language Big Book (PLBB) ***The Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous***, published November 1, 2024, celebrated its one-year anniversary, after considerable demand and four print runs, with 322,000 total copies in print.
- • Sales: First-year total print copies distributed (over its first 12 months) totaled 215,574 copies.
- • Revenue: First-year total revenue stands at \$1,908,706.98 (gross sales).
- • First-year print copies for distribution bought by IGCOs: 94,100 copies.
- • First-year International sales (to mainly A.A. GB and A.A. Australia GSOs) totaled 7,406 units.
- • First-year reported eBook sales totaled 7,789 units.
- • 2,240 eBook units were accessed in the first 12 months that the book was made available on tablets in corrections venues (as reported by Edovo).
- • Plain Language Big Book audiobook was approved by AAWS to move forward utilizing professional narrators experienced with A.A. literature at a leading professional audiobook production house, and it is on schedule to be released by mid-year, June 2026
- The Fifth Edition of the Big Book
 - A final draft will be reviewed at the 76th General Service Conference

Delegate's Connection, cont.

- If approved, it will move forward as part of A.A.'s collective conscience
 - The 12 Steps Illustrated pamphlet has been redesigned and will be available in a new display format <https://www.aa.org/twelve-steps-illustrated>
 - All facsimile First Edition Big Books (red and yellow cover) have now sold out

General Service Office (GSO)

- The GSO building renovation is complete and reopening is expected in early April

- Demand for services continues to grow:
 - Over 95,000 emails and nearly 1,000 calls were handled in a recent six-month period

?? Grapevine & La Viña

- The Grapevine/La Viña app has now:
 - Paid back its startup costs
 - Begun generating income
 - New books and ongoing calls for stories continue to support member engagement
- This is a strong example of how A.A. is using new tools to carry the message while remaining self-supporting.

?? Financial Snapshot (Why It Matters)

A.A. is currently facing some financial pressure:

- Contributions and literature sales came in below projections in 2025
- **The reserve fund is about 5–6 months**, below the goal of 9–12 months
- A literature price increase went into effect in February 2026
- Some services are being reduced or delayed

At the same time, demand for services is increasing.

2. ● More people are reaching out—but fewer resources are available.

Conference Preparation Is Underway

Since early February, I have received:

- Final Agenda Items
- Background materials across all Conference committees
- Financial reports, surveys, and planning documents

This is the work of the Delegate—not done alone, but with you.

Through:

- District meetings
- Delegate's Day of Sharing
- Ongoing conversations
- Home group meetings, if invited

—we are developing Area 48's collective conscience to bring to the Conference in April.

◆◆ Upcoming Opportunities

- **Spring Assembly & Report Back** (May16,Saratoga)

After Conference comes the Delegate's Report Back — when the Conference comes home to the Area.

This is where members get to hear what happened, what was decided, what was important, and what it may mean for our groups moving forward. It is not just a list of business. It is the chance to hear the story, the spirit, and the substance of the Conference from the person who was in the room. If you want to know how A.A.'s group conscience becomes Conference action, this is where it all starts to come alive.

Delegates Connection, cont.

What Happens Next

First, the delegate keeps listening. The delegate hears from groups, districts, Area members, emails, and conversations across the Area. Delegate's Day helps the delegate hear the sense of the Area, but it is not the last step. It is one part of getting ready.

Next, the delegate studies the full Conference agenda. The 76th General Service Conference has 14 committee sections or groups of business. These include committees like Literature, Finance, Public Information, Trustees, Agenda, and Report & Charter. The work of the Conference is much bigger than the few items any one Area may talk about before Conference.

Then the work begins in committees. Most items first go to a Conference committee. That committee reads the background, talks about the item, asks questions, and decides whether to make a recommendation. Some items move forward. Some are changed. Some are sent back for more work. Some do not move ahead at all. At the Conference, the delegate serves on one committee, (my committee is Report and Charter) but that does not mean the delegate votes only on that committee's work. When committee reports come to the full Conference, the delegate votes as a full Conference member on business from all the committees. That is an important part many of us do not realize.

For the 76th General Service Conference, the final agenda shows about 73 agenda items. That total includes new items, carryover items, standing items, and reports. So the delegate's job is not just to carry 8 proposals to New York City. The delegate's job is to listen carefully, prepare well, serve on a committee, and vote on all the Conference business.

So the short version is this: our Area discussed 8 selected items, but the delegate prepares for the whole Conference. The items are first worked on in committees. Then committee recommendations come to the full Conference floor. Then the full Conference votes. That is how a proposal moves from discussion to possible Conference action.

Most of all, thank you to everyone who took part in Delegate's Day of Sharing. Thank you for showing up, listening carefully, asking thoughtful questions, and sharing your experience and conscience. Your participation matters. It helps the delegate go to the Conference better informed, better prepared, and more connected to the voice of Area 48. That is real service, and it is deeply appreciated.

We also planned out the presentation that we're doing for the rest of the US/Canada Alt Delegates in May. I had a great time and really enjoyed chatting with the other Alt Delegates. We had met in NERAASA, but it was with the Delegates too and there was no discussion. The NERAASA roundtable was a meeting where the Northeast Regional Trustee relayed information to the delegates. I found the Reunion weekend to be extremely helpful and inspiring.\

On March 28th our Area had our Delegate's Day of Sharing. We had over 70 people at the venue and another 30 online! I was pleased with how smoothly it went and heard good feedback from attendees about how helpful it was. I was most impressed with the 8 people

that presented a Final Agenda Item and a succinct description of the background for it. I know Dolores will bring the well-informed conscience of our Area to the General Service Conference. I'm looking forward to our Voting Assembly in May in Saratoga Springs.

Proposal for Consideration

Area Spring Voting Assembly

Proposal: Make the Area Alternate Secretary a Stand-Alone Position

Currently, the Area Registrar serves as Area Secretary in the absence of the Area Secretary.

The Area Secretary is a distinctly different position from that of Registrar. Whereas the Area Registrar needs familiarity with GSO databases and must maintain almost constant contact with the registrars from all Area districts, standing in for the Area Secretary requires the Registrar to drop those responsibilities and instead be familiar with the procedures for taking minutes at Area events, distributing minutes through MailChimp, updating the Service Manual as needed, sending up-to-date minutes and Service Manual changes to the Newsletter Chair, and keeping in touch with the General Service Conference Coordinator. It does not seem prudent, realistic, or practical to ask the Area Registrar to step into that role, especially on short notice.

The Area Secretary and the Alternate Secretary could work together to coordinate schedules so that the Area Secretary's responsibilities are always covered by someone fully familiar with them. This would help ensure that minutes for Area Assemblies and other events on the annual calendar are recorded as accurately and descriptively as possible and made available to the fellowship in a timely manner.

This arrangement would also provide training if the Alternate Secretary chooses to stand for election when the Area Secretary rotates out of the position, and it would give the Area another service position. Having an Alternate Secretary as a stand-alone position would not increase any costs for the Area, as either the Secretary or the Alternate Secretary would be reimbursed for mileage and expenses for the events covered, as outlined in Section 5.0, Event Participation and Funding, of the Area 48 Service Manual. This change would take effect with the election of the next panel.

Speaking as the immediate past Area Secretary, I can say that I never felt comfortable asking the Area Registrar to cover for me in my absence, as the Area Secretary is such a distinctly different role from that of Registrar. I feel strongly that this change would help the Area function more smoothly

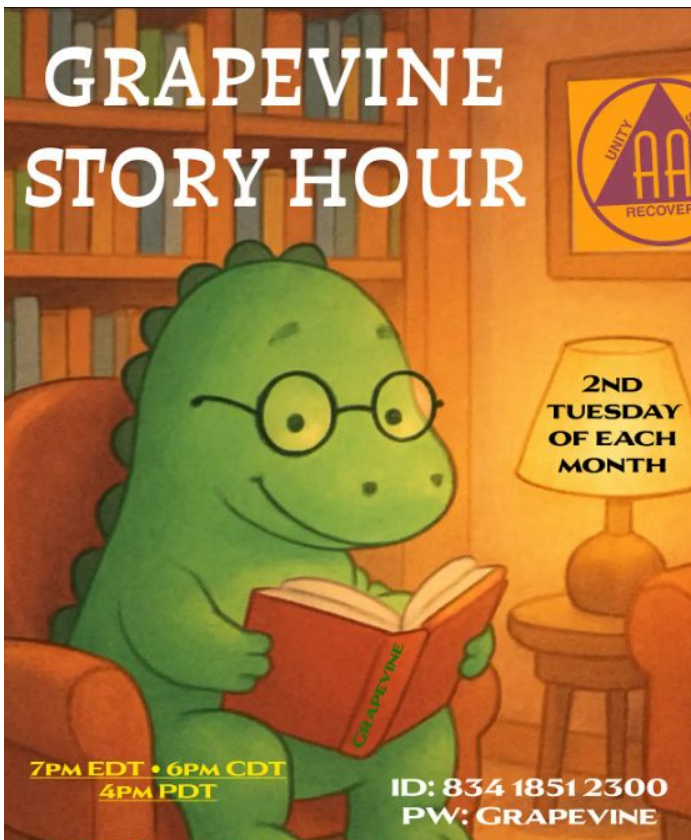
