## Principles of the Month | December

<u>Step 12</u>. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

<u>Tradition 12</u>. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

#### <u>Tradition #12.</u> Checklist [from SMF-131, Traditions Checklist from the AA Grapevine]:

- 1. Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if AA as a whole disappeared?
- 2. When I do not trust AA's current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
- 3.In my opinions of and remarks about other AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
- 4. Do I ever try to get a certain AA group to conform to my standards, not its own?
- 5. Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
- 6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition—or belie it?
- 7. Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
- 8. Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior—especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- 9. Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- 10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- 11. Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- 12. What is the real importance of me among more than a million AAs

**Concept 12.** The Conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government; that, like the Society it serves, it will always

## Chair/Alternate Delegate Report

#### Dear NENYmembers:

Well... we did it. Two full years of service together. I've rotated through more agendas, more Zoom links, more mics, and more "Can you hear me now?" moments than I ever expected when I made myself available to be Area Chair. And somehow, through all of it, you loved me, supported me, corrected me, and occasionally saved me from myself. For that, I'm endlessly grateful.

I learned a lot during this rotation:

- If you want to know how healthy a district is, just watch who shows up to the Assembly and who's lingering near the coffee.
- The phrase "I was just thinking..." usually means: buckle up.
- And "We'll make this quick" never—ever—means what we think it means.

But I also learned deeper things. I learned that service is where spiritual growth happens whether you planned for it or not. And I learned that Area 48 is filled with kind, wise, hilarious people who love Alcoholics Anonymous enough to give their time, their energy, and sometimes their last nerve.

Now I'm rotating into the Delegate role—equal parts excited and aware. It's a sacred responsibility, and I feel the weight of it. But I'm also comforted knowing I won't be doing it alone. I take all of you with me: your guidance, your conscience, your quirks, your passion, and your very strong opinions (which I promise to carry lovingly to the Conference).

And let me say this clearly: Panel 76 and our incoming Area Chair are absolutely ready. They are smart, capable, committed, and fully prepared for the magic, chaos, beauty, and occasional head-scratching moments that come with Area service. I have complete confidence in them. In fact, I'm hoping they will handle things so smoothly that no one will remember my amazing facility with Robert's Rules of Order. (So completely untrue.)

My hope for Area 48 is simple: that we keep growing together, keep laughing together, keep disagreeing respectfully, and keep remembering that at the end of the day, we are all just drunks trying our best to pass on a message that saved our lives.

Thank you for giving me the honor of serving. Thank you for your patience, your humor, your honesty, and your willingness to show up—even when it wasn't convenient, fun,quick (which, let's be honest, was often). You have changed me for the better, and I am deeply grateful.

#### NENY Area 48 2026 Budget

Amounts allocated are the <u>maximum</u> allowable expenditures for each category. Actual expenditures must be reported in writing and documented with receipts. Reports are due by April 15th, July 15th, Octob 15th and December 15th. The Finance Committee must review all reports past due before any payments are made. Allocated monies are disbursed when requested, and <u>only</u> when an accounting of the previous allocation has been made. Eligible expenses include mileage at 50.45 per mile, logo postage, support, opcies and other. Receipts and mileage details are required.

The funding for different events is based on a two-night hotel stay, registration, tolls and mileage to the 2024 event and estimated costs for the 2025 event. This approach aims to align the budget with actual expenses and to ensure equal opportunities for everyone weeking to seve in NENY Area 48. The funding is specific to each event and cannot be used for any other event. Participants living within a 25-mile radius of the event will not be emboursed for hotel costs unless specified accommodations are necessary. Funded members are encouraged to share expenses wherever possible.


