The AA Principles of the Month

Tradition 2 Checklist

1. Do I criticize or do I trust and support my group officers, AA committees and office workers? Newcomers? Old-timers?
2. Am I absolutely trustworthy, even in secret, with AA Twelfth Step jobs or other AA responsibilities?
3. Do I look for credit in my AA jobs, praise for my AA ideas?
4. Do I often feel the need to “save face” in group discussions, or can I yield in good spirit to the group conscience and work along with it? 1
5. Although I have been sober a few years, am I still willing to serve my turn with AA chores?
6. Do I complain about the decisions that my group makes, even though I do not attend the business meetings where these decisions are made?

World Concept II: The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole society in its world affairs.

World Concept Checklist

- Does our group have a general service representative (GSR)? Do we feel that our home group is part of A.A. as a whole and do our group's decisions and actions reflect that?
- Do we hold regular group conscience meetings encouraging everyone to participate? Do we pass that conscience on to the district, area, or the local intergroup meetings?
- Is the “collective conscience” of Alcoholics Anonymous at work in my home group? In my area? • Where do we fit in the upside-down triangle of A.A.?
- Are we willing to do what it takes to insure that our democracy of world service will work under all conditions

Officer and Committee Chair Reports

Delegates Connection

February 2026

Thank you, Area 48, for trusting me to represent your collective conscience at the General Service Conference for the next two years. It is an honor; it is a privilege, and I feel the responsibility to get it right on your behalf. I will be serving on the Report and Charter Committees. This committee protects how AA's General Service Conference works, ensuring that our service structure stays fair, transparent, and accountable to the groups—so AA can continue to serve alcoholics effectively.

Throughout the last year, individuals, groups, districts and areas have been submitting proposals for the Conference Agenda. The deadline for submission was September 30th. These proposed items are not the final agenda items for the Conference committee agendas. These 110 proposed items have been reviewed by trustees' committees, who forwarded them to a Conference committee, kept them at the Board for more information, or routed them to the A.A.W.S. or Grapevine Boards. Of those 110 proposals 20 have been forwarded as items to be under consideration or to be forwarded to the Conference. Those 20 Proposed Agenda Items (PAIs) were made available at Orientation Day on January 10. The final list of Conference committee agenda items will be available in early February following the General Service Board meeting. Those Final Agenda Items (FAIs) will be shared with your General Service Reps (GSRs) for your home groups to discuss prior to Delegate's Day of Sharing on March 28th.

A document composed of the PAIs with explanations of each one will be available to your DCMs shortly so your group will be able to come to an informed group conscience in time for the March Delegate's Day of Sharing. A questionnaire will be shared with the fellowship to inform me of your conscience. Your DCM will get them to the GSRs and bring them back to the Area through March.

I look forward to working with all of you, in getting this next Panel{75/76) to be the most effective we can, honoring the principles we all practice, and serving our various districts, members, and communities.

Group Conscience is the way every member has a voice in Alcoholics Anonymous.
I would like to remind us all, the structure of Area 48 is organized as districts, DCM's are the essential 'pipeline' for consolidation of the voice of those members, who, in considered discussion have determined through a group conscience the direction the group intends, and across all groups in the district, the DCM then communicates that to the Delegate. The importance of having groups involved and active in discussion and decision regarding group conscience of larger regional and broader issues is what provides our Delegate direction when those delegates gather in service at the yearly Delegate Conference. Results of those events are then shared with us in Delegate reports, where DCM's and others get information on decisions made, to bring back to their home districts, and by way of District business meetings, back to the GSR's to report back to groups and members.

Officer and Committee Chair Reports, cont.

Another attribute of Area 48 structure, is the division of the area into 5 clusters, where all districts in a cluster are intended to work and support each other in successful delivery of Area events, scheduled through the year, and scheduled in such a way as to rotate host responsibilities equitably through clusters and districts, offering an opportunity for all districts the privilege of service to host such events.

Service comes in so many forms, and it is sometimes overlooked how even the smallest acts could be transformative. Giving districts a space to involve members in delivering events for the benefit of Area fellowship and unity is such an occasion. Lets join together, work together, support each other in having these events be unifying, restorative and engaging, inviting members and friends to come, taste the benefits of fellowship. While some area events are more business, there are also those that focus specifically on growing in communication and fellowship, making and sustaining friendships, renewing and strengthening bonds. Simply sharing time and effort is also service, allowing space for a newcomer to see both our humanity and experience the transformation of the lives we now enjoy.

One last thought here, I share with sponsees and others: If you believe you have recognized and addressed those character defects and shortcomings our 'design for living' helps us identify, I believe rotations in service will absolutely allow more of those hidden defects to emerge, giving us a renewed opportunity to rely on our Higher Power for relief and resolution of what may remain hidden otherwise.

Treasurer's Report

Hello all, my name is JR and I am the current Area 48 treasurer. The treasurer, as you all know, keeps track of how we're doing financially, and reports on that to you, so you can make decisions about what we want to do or not do with our money. Also, I am the person who pays the bills, including reimbursements for clusters hosting Area events. I also make sure funds are available to Area officers for their activities, and provide for committee chairs to make purchases (especially the Literature and Grapevine/La Vina chairs). So that's my job in a nutshell. Here are some other things I'd like to do over my term in office

First, for each cluster over the next two years, I really want to have a 7th Tradition Workshop and I'm hoping to get that rolling as soon as possible. I think it's been a long time since we talked clearly about the seventh traditions and what it really means.

Second, I really want to change the way we do our financial reporting. Like so many of us, I have heard income and expense statements read verbatim many, many times: I get nothing out of it. It comes by too fast, and it's too much to keep track of. I want to try and find a happy median where you are aware of what we're spending, and what we have available. More importantly, I want to keep you aware of whether our overall finances are doing well or are in trouble: are we doing better or worse than usual in all the areas of our budget?

Finally, last year we started doing a treasurer meeting with all the district treasurers in the area. I intend to keep that up, as it's already scheduled: the third Monday at 6:30. Just being available to talk about the role and duties of the treasurer in the same way that we have DCM and GSR meetings. There's a link to the meeting on the area website under all the virtual meetings. The

link will also be part of a reminder to DCMs and treasurers a few days before the meeting. You can mail me if you need the link sent to you, or if you need any other information, I'm happy to respond. If I can't answer, I will find out and get back to you.

Proposals for Consideration

Area Spring Voting Assembly

Proposal: Make the Area Alternate Secretary a Stand-Alone Position

Currently, the Area Registrar serves as Area Secretary in the absence of the Area Secretary.

The Area Secretary is a distinctly different position from that of Registrar. Whereas the Area Registrar needs familiarity with GSO databases and must maintain almost constant contact with the registrars from all Area districts, standing in for the Area Secretary requires the Registrar to drop those responsibilities and instead be familiar with the procedures for taking minutes at Area events, distributing minutes through MailChimp, updating the Service Manual as needed, sending up-to-date minutes and Service Manual changes to the Newsletter Chair, and keeping in touch with the General Service Conference Coordinator. It does not seem prudent, realistic, or practical to ask the Area Registrar to step into that role, especially on short notice.

The Area Secretary and the Alternate Secretary could work together to coordinate schedules so that the Area Secretary's responsibilities are always covered by someone fully familiar with them. This would help ensure that minutes for Area Assemblies and other events on the annual calendar are recorded as accurately and descriptively as possible and made available to the fellowship in a timely manner.

This arrangement would also provide training if the Alternate Secretary chooses to stand for election when the Area Secretary rotates out of the position, and it would give the Area another service position. Having an Alternate Secretary as a stand-alone position would not increase any costs for the Area, as either the Secretary or the Alternate Secretary would be reimbursed for mileage and expenses for the events covered, as outlined in Section 5.0, Event Participation and Funding, of the Area 48 Service Manual. This change would take effect with the election of the next panel.

Speaking as the immediate past Area Secretary, I can say that I never felt comfortable asking the Area Registrar to cover for me in my absence, as the Area Secretary is such a distinctly different role from that of Registrar. I feel strongly that this change would help the Area function more



How Seventh-Tradition Contributions Keep A.A.'s Story Alive

Every letter, photo, document, and audio and video recording in the A.A. Archives at your General Service Office tells a story. Thanks to your Seventh Tradition contributions, the Archives—celebrating its 50th anniversary this year—continues to preserve and carry forward the history of our Fellowship. The Archives permanently documents the work of A.A., makes our history accessible to members and researchers, and provides essential context for understanding A.A.'s journey, principles, and purpose.

With the support of Seventh-Tradition contributions, the Archives was able to digitize more than 10,000 pages of Bill W.'s correspondence with the help of a new scanner—preserving these important letters for generations to come. Bill's letters offer an irreplaceable look into the growth of our Fellowship, the evolution of our Traditions, and the heart of one member who helped spark a global movement.

From early group correspondence to memorabilia from significant moments in our history, the carefully preserved pieces in the Archives provide insight, connection, and continuity. They help tell the story of our beloved Fellowship—and the impact of 90 years of carrying the message.
